The Action Center has a shelter program for couples, families and single adults. Clients may stay in the program for up to 45 days while working with Case Managers to develop goals and work toward self-sufficiency. Clients are expected to be working, looking for work or going to school while in the program. Diligent work toward goals and the development of a transition plan will help clients to prepare for a stable housing situation upon exit from the shelter. photo ID, Birth Certificate or something that proves identity to be considered for the Shelter Program, pass a background check with no history of violence (to be determined during screening and background check) or sex crimes. able to work, currently working or going to school. Able and willing to complete at least one chore daily. Able to work within the shelter community with a very diverse population. To return to the shelter by 8:00 pm, unless given prior permission by the Manager of Shelter Program to be a positive member of the shelter community to participate in scheduled meetings, groups and workshops to create and follow a transition plan to become self-sufficient. To abstain from drugs and alcohol while in the program to be stable on all medications.

Staff members live in the house, so they are a living example of stable, healthy lives.
