Everyone wants to be <u>noticed</u>.

Psalm 142:4 (GW)

Loudly, I cry to the LORD. Loudly, I plead with the LORD for mercy. I pour out my complaints in his presence and tell him my troubles. When I begin to lose hope, you already know what I am experiencing. My enemies have hidden a trap for me on the path where I walk. Look to my right and see that no one notices me. Escape is impossible for me. No one cares about me. I call out to you, O LORD. I say, "You are my refuge, my own inheritance in this world of the living." Pay attention to my cry for help because I am very weak. Rescue me from those who pursue me because they are too strong for me. Release my soul from prison so that I may give thanks to your name. Believing

Acts 16:31 (LB)

... "Believe in the Lord Jesus and you will be saved, along with everyone in your household."

Belonging

Romans 8:29 (LB)

Now you are no longer strangers to God and foreigners to heaven, but you are members of God's very own family, citizens of God's country, and you belong in God's household with every other Christian.

Becoming

Romans 8:29 (LB)

For from the very beginning God decided that those who came to him—and all along he knew who would—should become like his Son, so that his Son would be the First, with many brothers.

Ephesians 1:5 (NLT)

And you are like servants who are responsible for using God's gifts. So be good servants and use your gifts to serve each other. Anyone who speaks should speak words from God. The person who serves should serve with the strength that God gives. You should

do these things so that in everything God will be praised through Jesus Christ. Power and glory belong to him forever and ever. Amen.

401: Discovering My Mission

John 17:17 (MSG)

In the same way that you gave me a mission in the world, I give them a mission in the world.

4 <u>Members</u> make and keep <u>covenants</u>.

The difference between spectators and participants is summed up in one word: commitment.

Malachi 3:10 (ICB)

"Bring to the storehouse a tenth of what you gain. Then there will be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord of heaven's armies. "I will open the windows of heaven for you. I will pour out more blessings than you have room for."

Members make community a <u>priority</u>.

"We must grow smaller as we grow larger." We do this through weekend participation and making small group a priority.

Acts 2:42-47 (NIV)

They devoted themselves to the apostles' teaching and to fellowship, to the breaking of bread and to prayer. Everyone was filled with awe at the many wonders and signs performed by the apostles.
